ENTRY OF OUR LORD INTO JERUSALEM. PALM SUNDAY.

FIRST ANTIPHON

I love the Lord because He has heard the voice of my supplication. (*Psalm 114:1*) **Through the prayers of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us!**

Because He inclined His ear to me; therefore I will call on Him as long as I live. (*Psalm 114:2*) **Through the prayers of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us!**

The snares of death encompassed me; the pangs of hell laid hold on me. (*Psalm 114:3*) **Through the prayers of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us!**

I suffered distress and anguish, then I called upon the Name of the Lord. (*Psalm 114:4*) **Through the prayers of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us!**

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. **Through the prayers of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us!**

SECOND ANTIPHON

I kept my faith, even when I said, "I am greatly afflicted." (*Psalm 115:1*)
O Son of God, who sat upon the foal, save us who sing to You: "Alleluia!"

What shall I render to the Lord for all the things He has given me? (*Psalm 115:3*) **O Son of God, who sat upon the foal, save us who sing to You: "Alleluia!"**

I will receive the cup of salvation, and call on the Name of the Lord. (*Psalm 115:4*) **O Son of God, who sat upon the foal, save us who sing to You: "Alleluia!"**

I will pay my vows to the Lord in the presence of all His people. (*Psalm 115:5*) **O Son of God, who sat upon the foal, save us who sing to You: "Alleluia!"**

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen. Only-begotten Son and immortal Word of God, Who for our salvation willed to be incarnate of the holy Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary, Who without change became man and were crucified, O Christ our God, trampling down death by death, Who are one of the Holy Trinity, glorified with the Father and the Holy Spirit: save us!

THIRD ANTIPHON

(*Psalm 117:1*) **Tone 1** By raising Lazarus from the dead before Your Passion, / You confirmed the universal resurrection, O Christ God. / Like the children with the palms of victory, / we cry out to You, O Vanquisher of Death: / "Hosanna in the highest! // Blessed is He that comes in the Name of the Lord."

Let the house of Israel say: for He is good, for His mercy endures forever! (*Psalm 117:2*) By raising Lazarus..

Let the house of Aaron say: for He is good, for His mercy endures forever! (*Psalm 117:3*) By raising Lazarus..

Let all those who fear the Lord say: for He is good, for His mercy endures forever! (*Psalm 117:4*) By raising Lazarus..

Deacon: Wisdom! Upright!

Priest: Blessed is He that comes in the name of "Lord"! We bless you from the house of the Lord!
God is the Lord and has revealed Himself to us! O Son of God, Who sat upon the foal, save us who sing to You: Alleluia!

TROPARIA

Tone 1 By raising Lazarus from the dead before Your Passion, / You confirmed the universal resurrection, O Christ God. / Like the children with the palms of victory, / we cry out to You, O Vanquisher of Death: / "Hosanna in the highest! // Blessed is He that comes in the Name of the Lord."

Tone 4 When we were buried with You in baptism, O Christ God, / we were made worthy of eternal life by your Resurrection. / Now we praise You and sing: / "Hosanna in the highest! // Blessed is He that comes in the Name of 'Lord'."

KONTAKION

Tone 6 Sitting on Your throne in Heaven, / carried on a foal on earth, O Christ God, / accept the praise of angels and the songs of children, who sing: // "Blessed is He Who comes to recall Adam!"

The Prokeimenon in the Fourth Tone: Blessed is He that comes in the name of Lord! / God is the Lord and has revealed Himself to us! (*Psalm 117:26b, 27b*)

v: O give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; for His mercy endures forever! (*Psalm 117:1*)

THE EPISTLE OF THE APOSTLE PAUL TO THE PHILIPPIANS (4:4-9) Brethren: Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let all men know your forbearance. The Lord is at hand. Have no anxiety about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, do; and the God of peace will be with you.

Alleluia, Tone 1

v: O sing to the Lord a new song, for He has done marvelous things! (*Psalm 97:1*)

v: All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God. (*Psalm 97:5*)

THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN (12:1-18) Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus was, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. There they made him a supper; Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at table with him. Mary took a pound of costly ointment of pure nard and anointed the feet of Jesus and wiped his feet with her hair; and the house was filled with the fragrance of the ointment. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (he who was to betray him), said, "Why was this ointment not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" This he said, not that he cared for the poor but because he was a thief, and as he had the money box he used to take what was put into it. Jesus said, "Let her alone, let her keep it for the day of my burial. The poor you always have with you, but you do not always have me." When the great crowd of the Jews learned that he was there, they came, not only on account of Jesus but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. So the chief priests planned to put Lazarus also to death, because on account of him many of the Jews were going away and believing in Jesus. The next day a great crowd who had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" And Jesus found a young ass and sat upon it; as it is written, "Fear not, daughter of Sion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on an ass's colt!" His disciples did not understand this at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that this had been written of him and had been done to him. The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead bore witness. The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign.

Instead of "It is truly meet ...," we sing: God is the Lord and has revealed Himself to us! / Celebrate the feast and come with gladness! / Let us magnify Christ with palms and branches, / singing: "Blessed is He that comes in the Name of the Lord!"

COMMUNION HYMN Blessed is He that comes in the Name of the Lord! God is the Lord and has revealed Himself to us! (*Psalms 117:26b, 27b*) Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

Instead of "We have seen the True Light..." we sing: Tone 1 By raising Lazarus...



ALL PARISHIONERS Your help will be needed as we get closer to Pascha. Your help will also be needed twice on Great and Holy Friday. After the morning Royal Hours your help will be needed to set up the Tomb of our Lord for Vespers and then decorate it after Vespers. After the Lamentations that evening your help will be needed to change over all the candles from purple to white.

VIGIL AT THE TOMB OF THE LORD The Vigil is from Friday, April 14 at 10 pm until Saturday, April 16 at 10 am and then from 1 pm until 10:30 pm. Please email stnicholasburtonmi@gmail.com or call the office at 810-744-0070 if you will keep vigil. **If there are no persons to sign up for every slot during the overnight hours, the vigil will take place only before and after services. The signup sheet is in the fellowship hall.**

YOUTH NEEDED TO ASSIST ON GOOD FRIDAY to assist Father Matthew during the Vespers Service (3 pm) and at the Lamentations Service (6 pm). As Father removes the image of the body of Christ from the crucifix at Vespers, the children help by holding the winding sheet and covering the icon for Father. At the evening service, the young ladies of the parish (as well as family and friends), are invited to join in by sprinkling the Tomb with rose water during the Lamentations. After, the girls help lead the procession by scattering flower petals before the Tomb and our other young ones are invited to join in by bearing various instruments of the Passion.
