6th Sunday after Pentecost / Commemoration of the Holy Fathers of the First Six Ecumenical Councils "Lord I Call..." Tone 5

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my prayer arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>evening sacrifice!//</u> Hear me, O Lord!

After "Lord I Call..." the Reader reads the rest of Ps. 140 & Ps. 141 on pgs 31 in the pew book, then: STICHERA

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name! **Tone 5**By Your <u>pre</u>cious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ,
You have put the <u>dev</u>il to shame.
By Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, You have blunted the <u>sting</u> of sin

and saved us from the gates of death.//
We glorify You, O only begotten One.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

<u>Christ</u> was led as a sheep to the <u>slaugh</u>ter

in order to grant Resurrection to the <u>hu</u>man race.

The princes of hell were frightened by this,

for the gates of sorrow were <u>lift</u>ed.

Christ the King of glory had entered,

saying to those in chains: "Go forth!"//

And to those in darkness: "Come to the light!"

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

O great wonder!

The Creator of the invisible suffered in the flesh in His <u>love</u> for man and rose again immortal.

Come, O sons of nations,

let us worship Him,

for delivered from error by His compassion,//

we have learned to sing of one God in three Persons!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

We offer You our evening worship,

O never setting Light,

Who $\underline{\text{came}}$ in these last days to the $\underline{\text{world}}$ in the flesh;

Who even descended to hell to dispel its darkness.

Who has revealed the light of Resurrection to the <u>na</u>tions.//

Glory to You, O Lord and Giver of light!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You. **Tone 6**(for the Fathers) (Despairing for her life)

You were begotten from the Father before the <u>Morning Star</u>, but Arius taught wrongfully that You were created: in his ignorance he designated You as a <u>crea</u>ture, yet the Fathers of the Council proclaimed You as <u>Son</u> of God,//co-enthroned with the Father and the Holy <u>Spirit</u>.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

You were begotten from the Father before the <u>Morning Star</u>, but Arius taught wrongfully that You were created: in his ignorance he designated You as a <u>crea</u>ture, yet the Fathers of the Council proclaimed You as <u>Son</u> of God,//co-enthroned with the Father and the Holy <u>Spirit</u>.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord! SCRIPTURE READINGS

The Reading is from Genesis. [14,14-20]

Now when Abram heard that Lot his nephew had been taken captive, he numbered his own homeborn servants three hundred and eighteen, and pursued the enemy as far as Dan. And he fell upon them by night, he and his servants, and smote them and pursued them as far as Chobal, which is on the left of Damascus. And he brought back all the cavalry of Sodom, and he brought back Lot his nephew and all his goods and the women and the people. And the king of Sodom came out to meet him, after his return from the slaughter of Chodologomor and the kings with him, to the valley of Sabi; this was the plain of Kings. And Melchizedek, king of Salem, brought out bread and wine; he was Priest of the Most High. And he blessed Abram and said: Blessed is Abram by the most high God, who created the heaven and the earth. And blessed is the most high God, who has delivered your enemies into your hand.

The Reading is from Deuteronomy. [1,8-11 & 15-17b]

Moses said to the sons of Israel: See, I have delivered the land before you; go in and inherit the land which I swore to your fathers, to Abraham and to Isaac and to Jacob, to give it to them and to their seed after them. And I spoke to you at that time saying: I alone shall not be able to bear you. The Lord your God has multiplied you, and behold, you are to-day as the stars of heaven in multitude. May the Lord the God of our fathers multiply you a thousand times more than you are, and bless you as he has spoken to you. And I took from you wise and understanding and prudent men, and I set them to rule over you, captains of thousands and hundreds and fifties and tens and recorders for your judges. And I commanded your judges at that time, saying: Hear cases between your brethren, and judge rightly between a man and his brother and the stranger who is with him. You shall not have respect to persons in judging. You shall hear the small as well as the great. You shall not shrink before any man's person; for the judgement is God's.

The Reading is from Deuteronomy. [10,14-18 & 20-21]

Moses said to the sons of Israel: Behold the heaven and the highest heaven belong to the Lord your God, the earth and all that is in it. the Lord preferred your fathers, to love them: and he chose their seed after them, you above all nations, as it is at this day. So circumcise the hardness of your heart and stiffen your neck no longer. For the Lord your God is God of Gods and the Lord of Lords, the great God, mighty and awesome, who shows no partiality, who takes no bribe. He executes judgement for the stranger, the orphan and the widow; and loves the stranger, giving him food and clothing. You shall fear the Lord your God and serve him, and to him you shall hold fast, and take oaths in his name. He is your boast, he your God, who has done for you the great and wonderful things which your eyes have seen.

APOSTICHA

Tone 5 We magnify You in songs of praise, O incarnate Christ and Savior. By accepting the Cross and death for our sake, as the Lord and Lover of man, You overthrew the gates of hell,// and arose on the third day, saving our souls.

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

By being <u>pierced</u> in the side, O <u>Lover</u> of man,

You have poured out drops of life and sal<u>va</u>tion for all.

By ac<u>cepting</u> death in the flesh, You have granted us immor<u>tal</u>ity.

You have <u>freed</u> us by being <u>placed</u> in the tomb,

and have resurrected us with Yourself in <u>glory</u>, as God.//

Glory to You, O <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lover</u> of man!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved. Your crucifixion and descent into hell are awesome, O Lover of man. You have captured it, releasing the ancient prisoners. You have opened Paradise and given it to us.

Grant us purification of sins, who glorify Your Resurrection on the third day!

Make us worthy of Paradise// and save us, O Lover of man!

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore! For our <u>sake</u>, You accepted <u>death</u> in the flesh, to rise from the dead on the <u>third</u> day. <u>Heal</u> us from our earthly <u>passions</u>, and restore us from our evil transgressions;// and save us, O Lover of man!

Come, all Orthodox <u>Churches</u>, let us celebrate today in faith and true <u>wor</u>ship the <u>year</u>ly commemoration of the divinely-arrayed <u>Fa</u>thers who gathered at Nicea from through<u>out</u> the world!

There they refuted the godless <u>teaching</u> of <u>Ar</u>ius, banishing him from the catholic Church by a decree of the <u>council</u>.

They taught all to confess openly the <u>Son</u> of God, consubstantial and co-eternal with the <u>Fa</u>ther, proclaiming this with precision and true worship in the <u>Sym</u>bol of Faith.

Therefore, as we faithfully follow their divine <u>doc</u>trines, let us worship the Father, the Son, and the most <u>Ho</u>ly <u>Spir</u>it,// the consubstantial Trinity in one <u>God</u>head!

TROPARIA

Tone 5 Let <u>us</u>, the faithful, praise and <u>wor</u>ship the Word, co-eternal with the Father and the <u>Spir</u>it, <u>born</u> for our salvation from the <u>Virgin</u>; for He <u>willed</u> to be lifted up on the <u>Cross</u> in the flesh, to en<u>dure</u> death, and to <u>raise</u> the dead// by His <u>glorious</u> Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, **Tone 8 Troparion** (Fathers) You are most glorious, O Christ our God! You have established the Holy Fathers as lights on the earth. Through them You have guided us to the true Faith.// O greatly compassionate One, glory to You!

Amen. **Tone 8 Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion** For our sake You were <u>born</u> of <u>the Virgin</u> and endured cruci<u>fix</u>ion, O <u>Good One</u>, destroying <u>death</u> by death. Revealing the <u>Resurrection</u> as God, do not despise the <u>work</u> of Your hand! Reveal Your <u>love</u> for <u>man</u>, O Merciful One, and accept the Theotokos <u>praying</u> for us,// and save the des<u>pairing people</u>, O our <u>Savior!</u>
