23rd Sunday after Pentecost (8th of Luke) / St. John the Merciful, Patriarch of Alexandria/Ven. Nilus the Faster, of Sinai

"Lord I Call..." Tone 6

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear me, O Lord! Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

Reader reads the rest of Psalm 140 and Psalm 141 on pgs 31 & 32 in the pew book, then:

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name! **Tone 6** Possessing victory over <u>hell</u>, O Christ, since You are <u>free</u> among the dead, You as<u>cended</u> the Cross raising with Yourself those who sat in the <u>shades</u> of death.// Drawing life from Your light, O almighty Savior, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

Today Christ <u>tram</u>ples on death, for He is <u>risen</u> as He said!
Let us all <u>sing</u> this song, for He has granted <u>joy</u> to the world:
O Light unapproachable, O <u>Foun</u>tain of life!// O Savior almighty, have mercy on us!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice! Where shall we sinners flee from You, Who are in all creation? In heaven You dwell! In hell You trampled on death! In the depths of the sea? Even there is Your hand, O Master! To You we flee, and falling before You, we pray:// O You Who rose from the dead, have mercy on us!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications! In Your Cross, we glory, O Christ. We sing and glorify Your Resurrection. For You are our God,// and we know no other than You.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You. **Tone 4** (for St. John) (You have given a sign)

In mercy, O wondrous John, you followed the most merciful <u>Mas</u>ter. / You cast forth your bread, O venerable one, distributing to <u>those</u> in need. / <u>There</u>fore, O holy one, your memory is truly e<u>ternal.</u>/ We celebrate it with <u>faith</u> and love.// By your supplications, save us from temptations and tribulations, O most wealthy <u>bish</u>op!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

He Who sees what is hidden elevated you to a most magnificent throne. / He foresaw your <u>purity</u>, / the <u>right</u>ness of your mind, and your godly <u>pre</u>sence. / He anointed and perfected you with chrism, O <u>wise</u> one, / openly appointing you to be the <u>shep</u>herd <u>of</u> His flock.// You guided them to the heaven of divine desire, O divinely-eloquent John.

- V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord! The Lord granted all the requests of your heart, O truly <u>won</u>drous one. / You observed all the laws of sal<u>va</u>tion, / for you loved <u>God</u> and neighbor without limit, as your <u>very</u> self, / O divinely <u>bless</u>ed one. / You <u>satisfied those</u> in need.//Therefore, O John, we <u>hon</u>or you today.
- V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities. **Tone 8** (for Ven. Nilus) (What shall we call you)

 What shall we call you now, O holy one? / A river gushing forth from the spiritual Eden? / A torrent of gifts bestowed by God? / A flood of the grace of teaching? / A cup of wisdom and knowledge? / A most mighty intercessor? / A most active teacher?// Pray that our souls may be saved!
 - V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

What shall we name you, O venerable one?

Cultivator of the eternal gardens, O blessed one?

Husbandman of the spiritual vineyard of the faithful?

One most skilled in <u>God</u>-given laws?

Knower of God-inspired <u>teaching?</u>

Poet of the goodness of creation?

Instructor of peace?//Pray that our souls may be saved!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

What shall we call you now, O wondrous one?

Keeper of the sanctity of <u>mar</u>riage?

Protector of chastity?

Instructor of monastics?

Guide of virginity?

One who balanced both estates, having by experience <u>lived</u> through both?

Your divine deeds were many, and you greatly fasted for God.//

Pray that our <u>souls</u> may be saved!

John, the great pastor and beacon of Alexandria,

Who will not bless you, O most holy Virgin?

Who will not sing of your most pure childbearing?

The only-begotten Son shone timelessly from the <u>Fa</u>ther,

but from you He was ineffably incarnate.

God by nature, yet Man for our sake,

not two persons, but one known in two natures.

Entreat Him, O pure and all-blessed Lady,//

to have mercy on our souls!

APOSTICHA

Tone 6 Your Resurrection, O Christ our <u>Savior</u>, / the Angels in <u>heaven sing!</u> / Enable <u>us</u> on earth// to glorify You in <u>pur</u>ity of heart!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Destroying the <u>gates</u> of hell, / breaking the <u>chains</u> of death, / You resurrected the fallen human race as al<u>mighty</u> God!// O Lord, Who rose from the dead, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

Desiring to return us to <u>Par</u>adise, / Christ was nailed to the Cross and <u>placed</u> in a tomb. / The Myrrhbearing Women sought Him with tears, <u>cry</u>ing, / "Woe to us, O <u>Sav</u>ior! / How do You deign to de<u>scend</u> to death? / What place can hold Your life bearing <u>body</u>? / Come to us as You <u>promised</u>! / Take away our <u>wailing</u> and tears!" / Then the Angel ap<u>peared</u> to them: / "Stop your lamen<u>tations</u>! / Go, proclaim to the A<u>pos</u>tles: / 'The Lord is <u>ris</u>en,// granting us purification and great <u>mer</u>cy!'"

You came to the Virgin, <u>granting</u> life.

O Lord, Who <u>rose</u> from the dead,//<u>glory</u> to You.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, **Tone 8 Troparion** (St. John) By endurance you gained your reward, venerable Father; you persevered in prayer unceasingly; you loved the poor and provided for them in all things.// Blessed John the Merciful, intercede with Christ God that our souls may be saved!

Amen. **Tone 8 Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion** For our sake You were <u>born</u> of <u>the Virgin</u> and endured cruci<u>fix</u>ion, O <u>Good One</u>, destroying <u>death</u> by death. Reveal Your <u>love</u> for <u>man</u>, O Merciful One, and accept the Theotokos <u>pray</u>ing for us,// and save the des<u>pairing people</u>, O our <u>Sav</u>ior!
