25th Sunday after Pentecost (10th of Luke)/Ven. Alypius the Stylite of Adrianopolis

"Lord I Call..." Tone 8

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of <u>my</u> hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

Reader reads the rest of Psalm 140 and Psalm 141 on pgs 31 & 32 in the pew book, then:

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name! **Tone 8** We offer to You, O Christ, our evening song and reasonable service, for You willed to have mercy on us// by Your Resurrection.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me. Lord, Lord, do not cast us a<u>way</u> from Your face! For You willed to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice! Rejoice, O holy Sion:

Mother of the churches, the abode of God, for you were the first to receive remission of sins// by the Resurrection.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications! The Word of God the Father, begotten before the ages, in the latter times willed to be incarnate of the Virgin and endured crucifixion unto death. He has saved mortal man// by His Resurrection.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

We glorify You, O Lord,

for You voluntarily endured the <u>Cross</u> for our sake.

We fall down in worship before You, O almighty Savior.

Do not cast us away from Your face

but hear us and save us, O Lover of man,//by Your Resurrection!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Glory to You, O Savior Christ,

Only-begotten Son of God, who was <u>nailed</u> to the Cross// and resurrected from the tomb on the third day!

- V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord! We glorify Your Resurrection from the dead, O Christ, by which You have freed Adam's race from the tortures of hell,// and as God have granted to the world eternal life and great mercy.
 - V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities. Tone 1 (for Ven. Alypius) (O all-praised martyrs)

O most blessed Alypius,

from your youth you offered your life to <u>Christ</u> our God, and s<u>trength</u>ened by Him, you submitted the passions of your <u>body</u> to the will of the spirit.

Thus, you subjected that which is lower to that which is higher.//

Therefore, entreat the Lord that He grant our souls peace and great mercy!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

O Alypius, wise in God,

you were revealed to be a shining beacon,

il<u>lu</u>mining the earth with the splendor of your wonders and godly deeds.

Thus, at your repose, you were received into the presence of the never setting Sun.//

Therefore, entreat the Lord that He grant our souls peace and great mercy!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

O wise Father Alypius,

you were truly the example of an immovable pillar to all monastics,

for, high upon your pillar, you stood in vigilant prayer,

enduring both the heat of the <u>day</u> and the <u>cold</u> of the night.

Therefore, you received the divine gifts of the Spirit

to heal infirmities and drive away evil passions.//

Therefore, entreat the Lord that He grant our souls peace and great mercy!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 The King of heaven, because of His love for man,

appeared on earth and dwelt with men.

He took <u>flesh</u> from the pure <u>Virgin</u>

and after assuming it, He came forth from her.

The Son is one: in two natures, yet one <u>Per</u>son.

Proclaiming Him as perfect God and perfect Man,

we confess Christ our God!// Entreat Him, O unwedded Mother, to have mercy on our souls.

Tone 8 Descending from heaven to ascend the Cross, the eternal Life has come for death to raise those who are fallen; to enlighten those in darkness.//
O Jesus, our Savior and illuminator, glory to You!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!
We glorify Christ, who rose from the dead.
He accepted the human body and soul,
and freed both from suffering.
His most pure soul descended to hell, which He spoiled.
His holy body did not see corruption in the tomb.//
He is the Redeemer of our souls.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved. In <u>psalms</u> and songs we glorify Your Resurrection from the <u>dead</u>, O Christ. By it, You have freed us from the <u>tor</u>tures of hell// and as God have granted eternal life and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

O Master of all, incomprehensible Creator of heaven and earth, by Your suffering on the Cross You have gained passionlessness for me. Accepting burial and arising in glory, You resurrected Adam with Yourself by Your almighty hand. Glory to Your rising on the third day!

By it You have granted us eternal life and cleansing of sins// as the only compassionate One.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. **Tone 8** O un<u>wed</u>ded <u>Virgin</u>, who ineffably conceived God in the flesh.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, **Tone 1 Troparion** (Ven. Alypius) You were a <u>pil</u>lar of patient en<u>dur</u>ance, having imitated the forefathers, O ^<u>Ven</u>erable One:
Job in suffering and Joseph in temp<u>tations</u>.
You <u>lived</u> like the Bodiless Ones while yet in the flesh, Alypius, our <u>fat</u>her.//
Beseech Christ God that our <u>souls</u> may be saved!
