TONE 3

20th Sunday after Pentecost (5th of Luke) / Holy Equal-to-the-Apostles Abercius, Bishop and Wonderworker of Hieropolis / The Holy Seven Youths ("Seven Sleepers") of Ephesus "Lord I Call..." Tone 3

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord. Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You.// Hear me, O Lord. Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice.// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord.

Reader reads the rest of Psalm 140 and Psalm 141 on pgs 31 & 32 in the pew book, then:

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name! **Tone 3** By Your Cross, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, death's dominion has been <u>shat</u>tered; the devil's de<u>lu</u>sion destroyed. The race of man, being <u>saved</u> by faith,// always <u>offers You</u> a song.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me. All has been enlightened by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord. Paradise has been <u>opened</u> again. All creation, <u>prais</u>ing You,// always <u>of</u>fers <u>You</u> a song.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice! I glorify the power of the <u>Fa</u>ther and the Son. I praise the authority of the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit: the undivided, uncreated <u>God</u>head,// the consubstantial Trinity which <u>reigns</u> for<u>ev</u>er.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications! We bow down in worship before Your precious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, and we glorify and praise Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion,// for by Your <u>wounds</u> we have <u>all</u> been healed.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You. **Tone 2** (for St. Abercius) (Joseph of Arimathea)

With the splendors of divine teachings

you destroyed the night of polytheism, O Father A<u>ber</u>cius.

You revealed the dawn in all-glorious miracles,

making those who were in darkness children of the day.

Therefore, we all celebrate your holy <u>mem</u>ory with faith,//singing hymns to you, O divinely in<u>spired</u> one.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

You performed a miracle, O Father,

mingling wine and oil in a single vessel, preserving them in that way,

but when <u>needed</u> you caused them to separate by divine grace.

By your supplication you caused a gift of warm water to gush forth

healing the infirmities of those who approach you with faith//

and call you blessed, O Father Abercius.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord! Dedicating your whole self to God, O Abercius, you fulfilled the teachings of God.

You received grace from on high, O venerable one,

driving away mankind's many infirmities.

You destroyed the temples of the idols,//

planting the knowledge of God in those who languished in wretched ignorance, O <u>bles</u>sed one.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities. **Tone 4** (for the Holy Youths) (As one valiant among the martyrs)

The blessed Youths spurned the <u>e</u>vil commands:

submitting to God, they were bound, breaking the bonds of <u>false</u>hood.

Rejecting worldly rank, they have received the glory of perfection,//

which won for them the joy of the heavenly Kingdom.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

You trained yourselves mightily for the struggles of <u>suffering</u>, O Saints.

You hid in a cave, entreating the Lord.

With unceasing supplications you sought power and might from Him

through His wisdom and judgments as the Lover of man.//

In a godly manner He commanded all of you to fall asleep in peace.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Come, O people, let us earnestly hymn the witnesses of <u>pi</u>ety:

the divinely assembled regiment,

the blessed choir, the invincible company of martyrs,

the beautiful triumph of the Church of God,

the indivisible assembly,//

the unvanquished army and unshakable foundation of piety!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; **Tone 3** (for St. Abercius)

Venerable hierarch, most blessed Father A<u>ber</u>cius, /you are a wonder-worker and <u>fav</u>orite of God./ Shining forth in your pro<u>phet</u>ic life,/you have been granted apos<u>tol</u>ic gifts./Together with the Angels you ever minister before the <u>Sav</u>ior.//Pray that our souls may be de<u>liv</u>ered <u>from</u> all harm! now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. **Tone 3** (Theotokion – Dogmatikon) How can we not wonder at your mystical childbearing, O exalted Mother? For without receiving the touch of man, you gave birth to a Son in the flesh, O immaculate Virgin. The Son born of the Father before eternity was born of you at the fullness of time, O honored Lady. He underwent no mingling, no change, no division, but preserved the fullness of each nature. Entreat Him, O Lady and Virgin and Mother, to save the souls of those who, in the Orthodox manner, confess you// to be the Theotokos.

APOSTICHA

Tone 3 The sun was darkened by Your <u>Passion</u>, O Christ, but all creation was enlightened by the light of Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.// Accept our evening <u>song</u>, O <u>Lover of man!</u>

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty! Your life-bearing Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord, enlightened the whole universe, recalling Your cre<u>a</u>tion. Delivered from Adam's <u>curse</u>, we sing://O Almighty <u>Lord</u>, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved. You are the changeless God, Who, suffering in the flesh, were changed. Creation could not endure seeing You on the Cross. It was filled with fear while praising Your patience. By descending to hell and rising on the third day,//You have granted to the world life and great mercy.

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore! You endured death, O Christ, to deliver the race of men from death. You rose from the dead on the third day, raising with Yourself those who knew You as God// and enlightening the world. Glory to You!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. **Tone 3** By the will of the <u>Fa</u>ther, / without seed, of the Holy Spirit you conceived the <u>Son</u> of God./ He was born of the Father before eternity without a <u>mother</u>,/ but now for our sake He came from you without a <u>fa</u>ther!//Do not cease entreating Him to de<u>liver</u> our <u>souls</u> from harm!

TROPARION

Tone 3 Let the heavens rejoice!
Let the <u>earth</u> be glad!
For the Lord has shown <u>strength</u> with His arm.
He has trampled down <u>death</u> by death.
He has become the <u>first</u> born of the dead.
He has delivered us from the <u>depths</u> of hell, and has <u>grant</u>ed to the world//
<u>great mercy</u>.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, **Tone 5 Troparion** (St. Abercius) You emulated the zeal of the Apostles and shone forth like a morning star, and your works showed your God-given power: you guided the erring to God,// O hierarch Abercius.
